

Thankful Turkey

Supplies:

Paper (I'm using a paper grocery bag)
Markers or Crayons
Scissors
Painters Tape

Step 1: If you're using a recycled bag like mine, cut it open to get the most surface area.



Step 2: Draw out a simple turkey body -- think of the shape of a peanut. Add some eyes, a beak, and a gobble. Cut out the turkey



Step 3: Use the rest of the paper bag or some colored construction paper to create feathers. Make one feather and use it to trace all the others, this way you don't have to worry about making them all the same. Cut out the feathers.



Step 4: Think of something your are thankful for... write it down on a feather! Ask a grown up if you can hang it on a wall for everyone to see. Encourage other family members to add to your thankful turkey. If you do hang it on a wall, you'll want to use painters tape so you don't ruin the finish on your wall. Fill the turkey with feathers in time for thanksgiving.
